Autumn 1	
Caring for the natural world	 Christians believe that God created the Earth. Christians believe that Adam and Eve (man and woman) were the first humans. Christians believe that Adam and Eve were given the Earth by God to look after it and care for it. Christians believe they should also care for the world by looking after nature such as plants, gardens and animals.
Autumn 2	
Valuing new life – birth of Jesus	 Christians believe that Jesus was a special baby because he was the son of God. Christians celebrate the birth of Jesus on the 25th December – Christmas Day. Christians believe that Mary and Joseph were given Jesus by God. In the Christmas Story, Jesus was visited by three groups of people – the angel, the shepherds and the wise men.
Spring 1	
Worship & Ceremonies	 All religions use symbols and actions to represent their faith. Christians visit the church to worship, and their special book is called The Bible. Christians use a cross as their religious symbol. Muslims visit mosques to worship and their special book is called the Quran. Muslims use a star and moon crescent as their religious symbol.
Spring 2	
Belonging to a group	 A group is something you can be part of and can give you a sense of belonging. Groups can include your family, your class, football, cubs, brownies, faith groups. Faith communities believe a baby is a gift from God and welcome it into their faith group. Christians baptise their babies to welcome them into the Christian faith community. An Aqiqah ceremony is a Muslim ceremony that will welcome their new baby into the Ummah (Muslim community).
Summer 1	
Storytelling through sacred writings	 The Bible is a special book of stories for the Christian faith. The stories in the Bible have morals (lessons) and meaning. Jesus told stories to help show people how to lead a better life. His stories told of kindness, forgiveness, love and repent.
Summer 2	
Showing kindness and goodness	 Christians believe that followers should be kind and generous people by helping and giving to others in need. The Hindu faith teaches the importance of sharing with others. It is important to be friendly, caring and considerate (thoughtful) towards others. There are many stories throughout all religions that teach people how to be good and kind.
